



2011-2012 Arizona HOSA Chapter Awards

Chapter Awards Program! The AzHOSA Chapter Awards is a program designed for chapters to receive recognition for success in and out of the classroom. All HOSA chapters that are part of an approved CTE program are required to achieve the Bronze Chapter award. This program is designed to keep our membership strong and active. All documentation for awards will be due on March 1, 2012. Submission instructions will be available in January.

Bronze Chapter (required for all chapters)

1. Local Chapter Bylaws on record with State Office.
2. Minimum membership requirements (currently 10 paid members).
3. Provide list of local officers along with email addresses to State Office.
4. Submit Program of Work (POW) to State Office.
5. Hold at least 4 meetings per school year (submit minutes).

Bronze level chapters will receive an official certificate and their name will be listed on the Website and in the SLC program.

Silver Chapter (Bronze level plus the activities below)

1. Attend at least two AzHOSA conferences/trainings.
2. Have at least 5 students achieve a Bronze Level Member Recognition Award. Each level will count as one student.
3. Submit at least 1 newsletter article to Arizona HOSA for the "*Synapse*" or the National HOSA "*E-Magazine*".
4. Conduct a Chapter Community Service Project for JDRF.
5. Officer team creates a chapter budget.
6. Complete a chapter scrapbook and enter into the SLC Outstanding HOSA Chapter competition.
7. Have at least one State officer Candidate.

Silver level chapters will receive an official certificate, their chapter name on our website and in the SLC Program, Silver Chapter ribbons at the SLC, and a plaque presentation at the SLC.

Gold Chapter (Silver level plus the activities below)

1. Recruit a school administrator to attend a local or state AzHOSA event.
2. Local officers present to a middle or high school class about the benefits of AzHOSA.
3. Conduct or participate in a JDRF program that educates, promotes or raises money for JDRF.
4. Have at least 10 students achieve a Member Recognition Award (15 total). Each level will count as one student.
5. Recruit 2 new AzHOSA Professional Division members.
6. Invite State Officers to a local Chapter Event (banquet, social event, presentation, etc.)
7. Register members in at least 4 competitions
8. Have at least 2 State Officer Candidates.

Gold level chapters will receive an official certificate, their chapter name on our website and in the SLC Program, Gold Chapter ribbons at the SLC, a plaque presentation at the SLC.
