EXHIBIT OVERVIEW



In this edition we will cover two of the many exhibits: The Inflatable Brain and The National Marrow Donor Project.





INFLATABLE BRAIN EXHIBIT

This year's expo had an inflatable brain that allowed all attendees to see the human brain on a larger scale. This inflatable brain had labels for all the different areas and their functions. It also included information about different diseases and abnormalities while showing the differences in electrical signals!



NATIONAL MARROW DONOR PROJECT

The National Marrow Donor Project (NMDP), HOSA's premier service project, joined this year's ILC and offered opportunities to swab and learn more about marrow donation. This year, all eligible State Council members swabbed and joined that registry! Anyone 18 or older may join the registry, and anyone younger may join the Pre-Registry. I attended a session called "From Student to Health Professional" that covered the path to medical careers and the importance of planning early with pre-health advising. It emphasized that any major can work for healthcare, as long as you stay on top of grades and prerequisites. The session also highlighted the value of clinical experience, leadership, and personal balance through a holistic review process. – Allen Son

I attended a hands-on eye anatomy workshop led by Starla Ewan. In this workshop, we built clay eye models while learning how each part of the eye works and how vision differs in animals. As a visual learner, the interactive format helped me better understand how the eye and brain connect. - Jackie Martinez

The workshop I attended was led by a surgical tech and focused on their role during C-sections. She showed how surgical techs must be highly prepared and able to anticipate which tools the surgeon will need without being asked. It was eye-opening to see how much knowledge and precision goes into supporting a smooth and safe procedure. – Logan Fleischman

Zachary and Sadie

The workshop I attended was hosted by Lifepoint Health and highlighted the many opportunities they offer. Lifepoint is a network of medical facilities that helps students gain experience and guidance in their healthcare careers. The webinar covered different nursing pathways and explained the various roles and levels within the field. The instructor kept us engaged, encouraged interaction, and helped students connect and build relationships. – Zacharcy Kusch

I attended the PTCB and Finding Your Pharmacy Pathway workshops, which provided a clear overview of the pharmacy field. They covered essential steps for certification and licensing, like fingerprinting and registration. The sessions also highlighted the many career options, from clinical pharmacist roles to pharmacy technician specialties. – Sadie Hammond

Fabian

I attended the "Maintain Your Brain" workshop hosted by Hilarity for Charity, which focused on dementia and Alzheimer's. It used a fun, hands-on approach to explain how these conditions affect the brain in a simple, easy-to-understand way. The presenters also shared five habits to help reduce risk: cognitive activity, physical exercise, a healthy diet, good sleep, and emotional well-being. It was an engaging and informative session that showed how everyday choices can support long-term brain health.

Rasem

I attended a workshop on implanting cardiac devices led by a cardiothoracic nurse practitioner from Augusta Health. He explained how pacemakers and defibrillators work and showed videos of their implantation, which was fascinating. I see these devices often in the hospital, but never fully understood them until this session. We also learned why patients might need them—like after heart attacks or with conditions like VFIB. It was an eye opening and informative experience that really deepened my understanding of these life saving tools. – Rasem Abdallah
