By participating in this member recognition award program, you will have the opportunity to move through four levels of leadership development:

- Bronze
- Silver
- Gold
- Platinum

To be part of the Arizona HOSA State Recognition Award Program, your first step is to be a paid member at the local, state, and national level. It is your responsibility to complete each task assigned and have your chapter advisor evaluate and sign off as each task is concluded. After completing and submitting the necessary documents for your desired level, Arizona HOSA will review your application. If accepted, you will be recognized at the State Leadership Conference and your name will appear in the event program even if you are unable to attend. Your advisor will also receive the appropriate level certificate.

Through this process, you are expected to apply your knowledge and get involved in HOSA. Knowledge without application is soon forgotten. HOSA is not a "club", rather, it is an organization that provides opportunity for you to achieve your career goals in the health profession.

Submitting Applications for Individual Member Recognition

Submission for all Individual Membership Awards

Instructions are as follows:

- 1. Teachers will sign off on all the required projects and tasks for any acquired level of the Individual Membership Award.
- 2. The student will be required to upload their own application to the link provided on the website.
 - a. The submission form will require the student to indicate the highest level award they have achieved for the school year. (The paperwork submitted will serve as the evidence used to determine if the student has met all of the requirements.)
- 3. All levels require community service hours to be submitted to the Barbara James Service Award (number of hours varies by level). This is done by submitting hours through the <u>HOSA Activity Tracking System</u>.

Arizona HOSA reserves the right to conduct individual audits on chapters who submit members for any Individual Membership Award

PLEASE NOTE

Materials **MUST** be original and completed during the 2023-2024 membership year (Aug 1 - July 31). Applications with materials from previous years will not be accepted. You must complete all lower tiers before moving onto the next one. For example, to complete the platinum tier, you must have first done bronze, silver and gold. To complete gold you must have done bronze and silver etc.

Prerequisite – Bronze Level

Silver Objective: To encourage increased participation in your HOSA chapter and community as well as developing professional and career skills.

Instructions: Silver level members will be recognized for satisfactorily completing the skills and tasks assigned in each of the sections below. When you have completed a task or assignment, ask your HOSA advisor to initial the space to the right of the skill or task assigned. Submit the completed form to the submission link on our Arizona HOSA website. Reminder that all items for the Bronze level must also be submitted in order to achieve Silver level recognition.

Write a 250-word minimum essay that includes the following information: Evaluator's

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- a. Entrance and program requirements
- b. The location of the program
- c. A paragraph comparing the three programs you've chosen

Community Service

- 1. Identify one health care issue facing your community and write a letter to a local/state leader or policy maker on the problem in your community with the intent to gain their support in creating change. List the issue below:
- 2. Lead a class discussion on the community issue you identified.

OR

Prepare a poster or bulletin board that illustrates the magnitude of the community health issue you have identified.

3. Complete 20 hours of community service. Enter the community service hours in the Barbara James Service Award event.



Personal Development

 Attend a workshop or training having to do with public speaking or leadership development. Examples include sessions at the Fall Leadership Conference, workshops at Chapter Leadership Camp, or another conference. Write a reflection of the learning that took place and how helped to become a better leader and future health professional. (Reflection should be 250-300 words)

<u>OR</u>

 Download the Healthy Living competitive event guidelines and create a personal healthy living SMART goal (see points 13 & 16 in the Healthy Living event guidelines). Keep that goal for at least two (2) weeks and summarize your goal, process, and results in 250-300 words.

Gold Level

Prerequisites – Silver and Bronze Level

Gold Objective: To encourage increased participation in leadership within the HOSA chapter and community as well as developing and reflecting on leadership skills.

Instructions: Gold level members will be recognized for satisfactorily completing the skills and tasks assigned in each of the sections below. When you have completed a task or assignment, ask your HOSA advisor to initial the space to the right of the skill or task assigned. Submit the completed form to the submission link on the Arizona HOSA website. Reminder that all items for the Bronze and Silver levels must also be submitted in order to achieve Gold level recognition.

Career Development Evaluator's Initials 1. Complete a job application for a job of your choosing and submit the completed application to Arizona HOSA. 2. Submit a resume and cover letter for the job you applied for. Evaluator's **Community Service** Initials 1. Participate in a community-wide project for the HOSA national service project. OR Participate in a community service project for another organization. Identify the project theme and goals: 2. Complete 50 hours of community service. Enter the community service hours in the Barbara James Service Award event. (Service hours must be different than the project used for item #1.)



Personal Development

- 1. Read one of the following books and write a 500-word essay about what you learned and how you can apply it to become a better HOSA leader.
 - a. Atomic Habits: Tiny Changes, Remarkable Results
 - b. The 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership
 - c. <u>5 Voices How to Communicate Effectively with</u> <u>Everyone You Lead</u>
 - d. <u>The Student Leadership Challenge: Five Practices for</u> <u>Becoming an Exemplary Leader</u> OR
- 2. Pick a TedTalk video that focuses on leadership and personal growth and write a 500-word essay about what you learned and how you can apply it to become a better HOSA leader. Identify the title of the TedTalk here:
- 3. Read about, watch, or conduct two (2) interviews with successful professionals in the health industry. In a 400-word summary write about the following:
 - a. What they believe are the personal traits/skills that they believe are crucial to success in the health care profession
 - b. How they were successful and what you have learned from the interview.

Using the Prepared Speaking competitive event guidelines, give a 3-5 minute talk about how HOSA has developed you as a student, a leader, and a future health professional to a group outside of school. Examples of groups to present to include: organizations around campus, a school board meeting, local elementary or middle schools

HOSA Member Recognition Award Program Platinum Level Prerequisites – Gold, Silver, and Bronze Level

Platinum Objective: To show a greater than average level of involvement in HOSA and the community as well as implementing the leadership and professional skills developed through the Member Recognition Award Program.

Instructions: Platinum level members will be recognized for satisfactorily completing the skills and tasks assigned in each of the sections below. When you have completed a task or assignment, ask your HOSA advisor to initial the space to the right of the skill or task assigned. Submit the completed form to the submission link on the Arizona HOSA website Reminder that all items for the Bronze, Silver, and Gold levels must also be submitted in order to achieve Platinum level recognition.

Career Development

1. Letter of Introduction. This is a letter introducing you to the Platinum Member Awards Committee. It must include:

- Information on what you have learned through the process of becoming a Platinum Member
- Describes why you are applying for Platinum membership
- The letter must be dated and include a signature line with the member's full name and signature
- A greeting statement to the awards committee
- Must be a minimum of 250 words.
- 2. Write a 250 word summary of 10+ hours of a work-based learning experience or supervised practical experience. Examples include:
 - Job shadowing
 - Career exploration
 - Internships
 - Volunteering

The work-based learning experience can be completed as a part of the health science class or done on the applicant's own time.

Exact hours, dates, people shadowed, and a description of the experience must be included.

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Personal Development

Evaluator's Initials

- 1. Include a school transcript or recent report card or copies of certificates or documentation that shows completion of training in health-related skills (industry certificates). Examples include:
 - CPR
 - EMT
 - CNA
 - First Aid
 - Nursing or Biotechnology programs
 - Any other health related skill
- 2. In this technological age, it is important to have a professional online presence. We ask that you create a professional LinkedIn, Tallo, or similar page. We ask that you also do the following:
 - Use a professional photo (no selfies)
 - Submit a link to your profile in the Wufoo form
